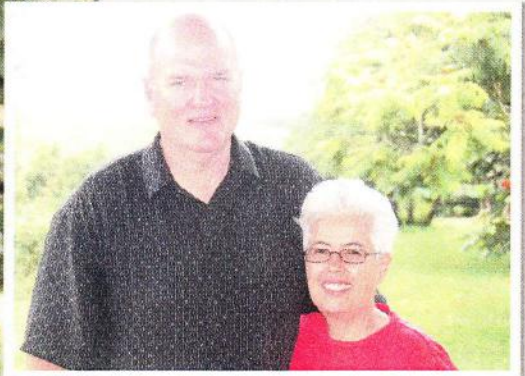
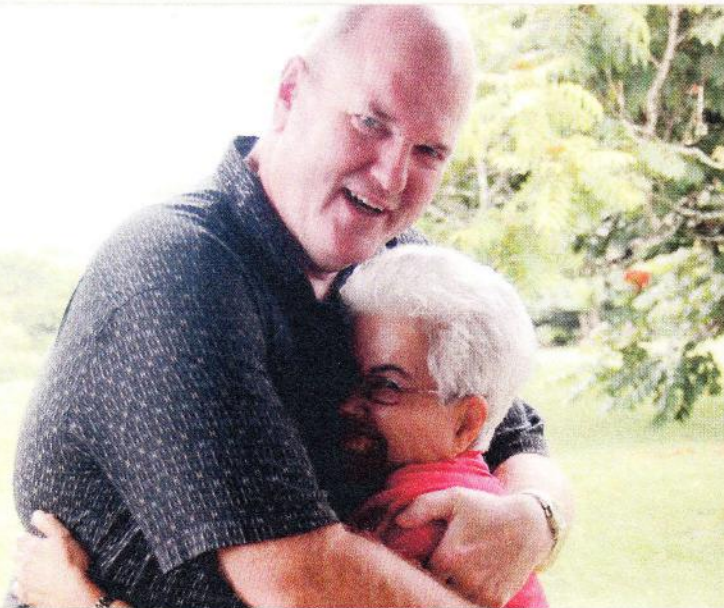




ZION EVANGELICAL MINISTRIES OF AFRICA FOCUS ON SWAZILAND

Trumpet of Zion: an exciting new radio ministry

For most of Dudley Donaldson's adult life, he worked in Christian radio. But when he and his wife Inge felt God's call on their life to work with the amaZioni in Swaziland, he was content to leave radio ministry in his past. The first two years of ministry in Swaziland were very exciting for the Donaldsons. When people asked Dudley if he was going to

use radio in Swaziland, his answer was no—he was there solely to teach God's Word. But when Trans World Radio contacted Dudley about developing a program to reach the amaZioni, he agreed to produce the pilot. Shortly after this, supporters from CCC provided Dudley with the funds and equipment necessary for an entire year

of radio airtime, and Dudley felt God's leading towards this opportunity. After much prayer and preparation The first broadcast was on March 4th, and already the Donaldsons are seeing and hearing exciting responses to the program. They are confident that God will use this ministry to advance his Word throughout southern Africa.



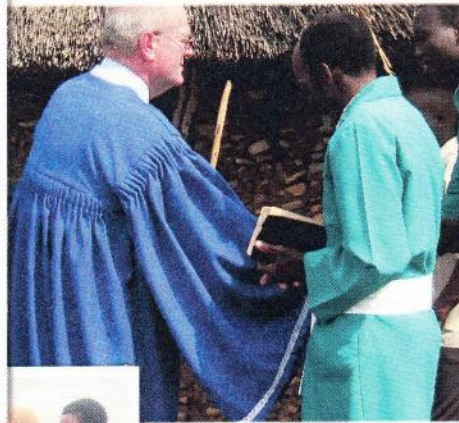
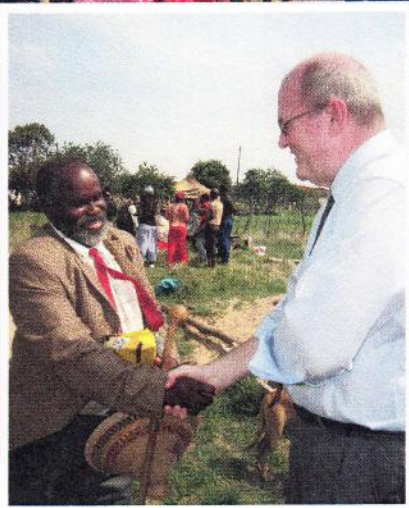

One thing you might not otherwise know about the Donaldson's ministry in Swaziland is that they have a heart of compassion for the poor and needy around them.
